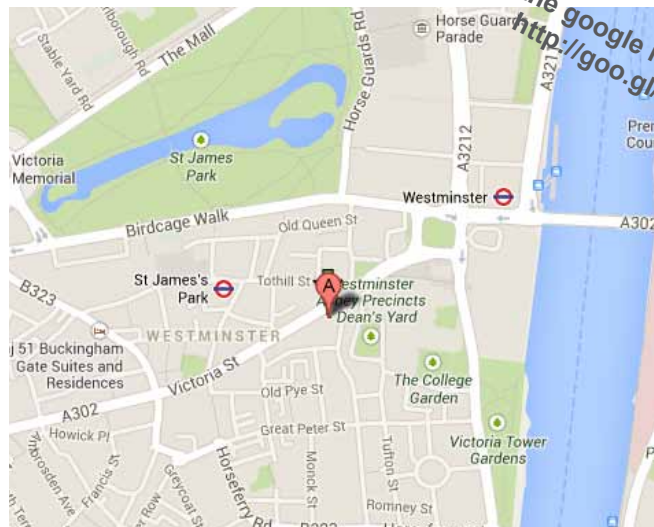
Travel Costs
